Leads Worship and Officiates Rites of Passage

We explored the theme of Living Love through the Practice of Story in January. Our service on the 12th on the power of story turned into an "all Zoom" one because of icy conditions in the parking lot, and it was wonderful to be able to use some of the hymn videos that Jared and his family created during COVID. People said there was a real sense of community despite not being together physically. We had a service on the story we tell about the U.S. on the eve of the inauguration, and Britton Gildersleeve served as worship associate for the first time – a welcome addition to the team. The month ended with a wonderful service led by Victoria Taylor with stories shared by Brenda Philips, Dick Luke, Carol and Jim Kern, KC Arceneaux, Lisa Evanylo, Jared Gibbs, Amanda Morgan, and George Lally. The response makes it clear that people really enjoy hearing from other congregants. We'll be inviting several congregants to participate in a service about following different faith traditions in addition to Unitarian Universalism. February's theme is Living Love through the Practice of Inclusion.

I officiated at the celebration of the life of Annette Burr on January 18th. Thanks to members of Katherine Allen's Soul Matters small group for greeting and providing refreshments for the reception.

Provides Pastoral Care and Presence

Many people have been alarmed and depressed in response to the actions of the new administration, on top of other stressors having to do with family transitions and health issues. In addition to offering pastoral care myself, I've referred some people to our Lay Pastoral Care team. This is a time when we can offer support to each other in community.

Encourages Spiritual Development for Self and Others

We finished up the sessions on New (or not so new) to UU, and one of the participants signed the book the next week. I've been listening to the Common Read – *Authentic Selves*, which has been a good way to learn about ways we can support transgender and nonbinary people and their families.

The Committee on Ministry has been supporting me in taking more time for myself, and I took two study leave days to give myself time for reading and reflection.

Witnesses to Social Justice in the Public Square

I attended the MLK Service at Asbury Methodist Church on MLK Sunday. I attended the Dialogue on Race Winter Summit, as did several UUC members. I've been contacting our congressman more regularly to let him know about my concerns over the usurpation of Congress's role – allowing the executive branch and the DOGE employees to shut down programs and end funding that Congress had already approved. I've sent emails to my state delegate and senator to support bills in the General Assembly that are supported by the Virginia Interfaith Center for Public Policy and Virginia Interfaith Power & Light. I've also signed up to be part of the UUSC (UU Service Committee) Together, We Rise -- Rapid Response Team "a mobilization network ready to take action when civil liberties, democracy, and human rights are at risk. By joining, you'll receive urgent alerts and opportunities to advocate, amplify frontline voices, and pressure policymakers to protect our communities." I haven't received any alerts yet.

Leads Administration

I met with the Grounds Committee to discuss how to move forward, and they have written a job description for a Grounds Manager for the board to discuss.

I've also met with the Stewardship committee, which has a great campaign planned with the theme **In UU We Trust**. We'll be having a Sunday Service Brunch on March 2nd at which people will be encouraged to submit their pledge. Board members are encouraged not only to attend but to help provide some of the food (sign up here). Mary Ann Hansen's excellent video appeal for stewards encouraged several new people to sign up, so we have twice as many stewards [20] as last year. I encourage board members to consider acting as stewards – it's a good way to get to know members of our community. Jamie will be leading steward training on February 23rd.

I met with the Connections Committee, who are planning a Newcomers Orientation on April 12th.

Gertrud Montgomery has joined the Committee on Ministries. As noted above, they have been supporting me in taking more time for study leave and vacation so I don't get burned out. I'll be sharing a "Self-Care Calendar" with them.

Serves the Larger Unitarian Universalist Faith and Leads the Faith into the Future

I continue to meet with the Joseph Jordan Cluster of UU Religious Professionals (online during the winter months) and the Blacksburg Ministerial Association. The BMA is tentatively planning a Lenten Series of Wednesday evening simple suppers and short services hosted at different congregations. UUC is slated to host on March 19th, and I would appreciate help organizing volunteers to bring soup and bread for our guests.

I look forward to attending the SEUUMA (Southeast UU Ministers Association) retreat in early April and the UUMA (UU Ministers Association) meeting in June before the UUA General Assembly in Baltimore, Maryland. We should choose delegates from UUC before the March 31st deadline for early bird registration.
