It was an exciting morning! A piece of heavy equipment arrived on the grounds to do "first aid" on the washed-out ditch along our driveway entrance. Within several hours, the small stones were removed from the ditch and hauled and spread to the back Lark Lane entrance. Large riprap was delivered and placed in the ditch on top of the new erosion control fabric.



The "frosting on the cake" was the backhoe moving to the problematic bio detention pond where Joe Powers supervised moving clay and dirt to improve the drainage function of the pond.

Looking back on the past ten months, we are delighted that UUC's grounds have been heavily used and enjoyed by congregants, friends, neighbors and wildlife: the winter Festival of Lights and Luminaries, church meetings, children's water play, men's breakfasts, memorial services, family gatherings, weddings, women's Friday lunches, yoga, birds nesting, dogs walking, treasure hunts for the children, a resting fawn, hanging out, youth group meetings, rock paintings, and bee activity.



How is this usage made possible? It's largely due to the time and labor contributions from a decrepit and aging volunteer crew (a not so subtle plea for new volunteers).
